

- 2. Development of infrastructural facilities by constructing additional rooms exclusively for PG.
- 3. Life skill training to students –First-aid, Certificates courses in Computer and Phenyl making.
- 4. Industrial tour to be organised for practical exposure to the students.
- 5. Conducting coaching classes to the aspirants to face competitive examinations.
- 6. Career guidance programme to be conducted by inviting outside agencies.


